Recovinyl® Recycling Achievement: 769,234 Tonnes Recycled in 2019

Recovinyl can proudly announce that 769,234 tonnes of PVC were Recycled in 2019 – an increase of 4.7% on the previous year. The 769,234 Recovinyl total contributes to the 777,313 tonnes recycled within the VinylPlus framework in 2019; more than 96% of the program's target for 2020 and an increase of 4.3% compared to the previous year.

The PVC industry is well on track to meet VinylPlus' ever more challenging recycling targets for 2025, in line with the Circular Economy and the ambition of the Circular Plastics Alliance and EU policy initiatives to encourage recovery, recycling and reusing of plastics. Following the European Commission's pledging call for the entire plastics industry to boost recycling, VinylPlus has committed to recycling at least 900,000 tonnes of PVC per year into new products by 2025 - securing further its place in achieving Europe's Circular Economy strategy.

Continuous recycling of valuable PVC material is in the best interest of a sustainable society and therefore Recovinyl are extremely pleased to see the amount of PVC being recycled increasing year on year. In 2019, demand for recycled rigid PVC remained very high. At the same time, more PVC waste was available from cables – particularly in the Czech Republic, France, Germany, Poland and the UK – due to reduced exports to China.





These positive results would not be attainable without all the recyclers and converters that participate in Recovinyl. Therefore, we would like to sincerely thank all recyclers and converters for permitting Recovinyl to achieve these great results, we couldn't have done it without their continuous effort and support.
